A BIBLE STUDY ON THE PROPHET JONAH

This week's Bible Study is the ninth in a current series on Old Testament prophets. This week's study considers how Jonah became the prophet who defied God.

Jonah 2:2-9 (Jonah's prayer of thankgiving for his rescue from the belly of the great fish)

²"In my distress I called to the LORD,

and he answered me.

From deep in the realm of the dead I called for help,

and you listened to my cry.

³You hurled me into the depths,

into the very heart of the seas,

and the currents swirled about me;

all your waves and breakers swept over me.

⁴I said, 'I have been banished from your sight; yet I will look again toward your holy temple.'

The engulfing waters threatened me,

the deep surrounded me;

seaweed was wrapped around my head.

⁶To the roots of the mountains I sank down;

the earth beneath barred me in forever.

But you, LORD my God,

brought my life up from the pit.

⁷"When my life was ebbing away,

I remembered you, LORD,

and my prayer rose to you, to your holy temple.

8"Those who cling to worthless idols turn away from God's love for them.

⁹But I, with shouts of grateful praise, will sacrifice to you.

What I have vowed I will make good.

I will say, 'Salvation comes from the LORD.'"

People may argue about whether a person named Jonah really was swallowed by a fish and disgorged back onto land after three days, but that is not the point of the

Medieval theologians interpreted the story of Jonah as a model for the resurrection of Jesus Christ. The comparison is striking. Jonah spent three days in the belly of a large fish before emerging. Jesus spent three days in the grave before rising from death. In this second chapter of Jonah, Jonah suffered in the "realm of the dead" until God "brought (his) life up from the pit" (from death).

Jonah story. The question asked and answered by the book of Jonah is whether God's mercy and salvation are available to wicked nations and wicked people.

Jonah rejected God's call for him to go to the city of Nineveh and preach against the wickedness that dominated life there. This second chapter of the book of Jonah is a 'prayer of thanksgiving' about how Jonah's rejection of God's command alienated him from God, how he suffered the torments of a self-imposed hell ("Sheol") in the belly of a fish and how a merciful God "brought (his) life up from the pit (grave)." Jonah realized that "When my life was ebbing away...my prayer rose to you (God)." He concluded by confessing, "Salvation comes from the Lord."

Whether it is plausible or not, the story of how Jonah came to be swallowed by a fish is worth reading because it is a fascinating story that teaches an important lesson. God wanted Jonah to go on a mission to Nineveh (the capital of Assyria, an enemy of Israel) but Jonah refused and fled to Tarshish (at the west end of the Mediterranean Sea). While on a boat to Tarshish, a violent storm came up. The sailors feared that their boat would capsize. They cast lots that pointed to Jonah as the cause of this storm. Jonah confessed that he worshipped God who controlled the storm and told them to "pick me up and throw me into the sea and it will become calm" (v1:12). After much consternation about whether to really do this, while the storm raged even more, they finally decided their only hope was to cast Jonah overboard. This calmed the storm, a huge fish swallowed Jonah and he spent the next three days in the belly of the fish before it disgorged him onto the shore.

After Jonah was saved from this descent into his grave ("the pit") in the belly of the fish, he agreed to go to Nineveh where he succeeded in getting the Assyrian King and his people to turn to God. God was so pleased that he decided not to carry out the destruction of Assyria that he had planned. But instead of being happy with this outcome, Jonah became angry and despondent. He asked God to let him die: "I'm so angry I wish I were dead" (v4:9). Instead of praising God for having mercy on these people, Jonah remembered how Assyria had conquered Israel and devastated God's people? He apparently thought the Assyrians were such bad people that God must never forgive them. That is why he didn't want to go there in the first place.

God told Jonah he was wrong in thinking this and ended the story by asserting: "should I not have compassion for the great city of Nineveh?" (v4:11). Plus, we should note that the non-Jewish sailors who threw Jonah into the sea became believers when this calmed the sea: "The men greatly feared the Lord...and made vows to him" (v1:16). The real point of the book of Jonah is that God is a universal God who has concern for all people in the world. God's salvation is available to all people.

A contract to replace the old water pressure system with a new system has now been signed and installation is scheduled to take place on January 19th. The Property Board hopes this installation will be successful in making Grace's water supply safe to drink--to the satisfaction of the Ohio EPA.
