A FOCOS on Coaching

Once a year we enroll a group of new participants in the FOCOS (Foundation Coaching Skills) Training. The training mostly takes place virtually over the course of 9 months, but during it there is a 1 week, in-person intensive training. It is my (Zina) second year to help with training with FOCOS but my first time to be at the in-person week in Romania. We had 15 participants from Belarus, Romania, US, and Moldova and among them there were also 3 non-believers. I had already coached 2 of the participants for 3 months, so I was glad to meet them in person during this week, and here is what they had to say:

"Coaching has helped me in two big ways, first, giving me tools to communicate with people. Since I started, I have been applying my skills in communication with my family, church, and volunteers. It has lifted my communication to a higher level. It has made a tremendous change in how I approach people, and it really helps me to see people as God sees them, and to listen to people how God listens us. And secondly, it's a great opportunity to influence people. When I offer a coaching session, people are much more open to partner with me."

"Coaching brings up a lot of awareness about yourself, and you bring out the best in the other people by helping them establish objectives, or giving them constructive feedback. I have seen how it helps us both to develop and it has been very useful. I can see improvement with my family too, because I can give feedback that actually helps them, and so I have noticed I have a better relationship with my family now."

A BIBLE STUDY ABOUT JESUS' RESURRECTION

About this Month's Bible Study. Last month's Bible Study used a crucifixion image from the 16th century Isenheim Altar to help us understand how Jesus and those closest to him suffered during Jesus' crucifixion. That image is visible when the Altar is closed. This

month's Bible study considers an image on the Altar when it is opened. The Altar's second opening displays images of the Annunciation, Concert of the Angels, the Virgin and Child, and Jesus' Resurrection. For this month after Easter, we will use the Altar's remarkable image of Jesus' Resurrection to explore this central event in our Christian faith that we have just celebrated as last month ended.

11 Meanwhile, Mary (Magdalene) was standing (outside) by the tomb, weeping. Even as she wept, she bent down to look into the tomb ¹² and saw two angels in white, one seated at the head and the other at the foot of the place where Jesus' body had lain. ¹³" Woman," they asked her, "why are you crying?" She told them, "Because they took my Lord away and I do not know where they put him." ¹⁴She had just said this when she turned around and caught sight of Jesus standing there. She did not realize, however, that it was Jesus. ¹⁵" Woman," he asked her, "why are you crying? Who is it you are looking for?" Thinking that he was the gardener, she said, "Sir, if you are the one who has carried him off, tell me where you have put him, and I will take him away." ¹⁶Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned to him and cried out (in Hebrew), "Rabboni!" (which means "Teacher"). ¹⁷Jesus said, "Do not cling to me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and tell them, "I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God!" ¹⁸Mary Magdalene went to the disciples. "I have seen the Lord!" she announced, reporting what he had said to her.

This dialogue is the Apostle John's record of humankind's first encounter with the resurrected Jesus. Mary Magdalene's words about this seminal event, "I have seen the Lord," confessed that Jesus, who "was crucified, died, and was buried" (Apostles Creed), is "risen indeed" (Luke 24:34). Mary was the first person to see proof that God had conquered sin and death.

What this dialogue says about the resurrected Jesus is fascinating. Perhaps it also tells us something about the form of resurrection reality. When Mary first saw Jesus standing beside the empty tomb, "she did not realize that it was Jesus." Remember how the two men who walked together with a stranger on the road to Emmaus after Jesus' crucifixion, also did not recognize that this stranger was Jesus until "they were at table...he took the bread...and gave it to them and their eyes were opened" (Luke 24:30).

This scripture tells us how Mary only recognized Jesus when he called "Mary" by her name in the same way that Jesus' good shepherd "calls his own sheep by name" (John 10:3). After Mary recognized Jesus, he instructed her to not embrace him. This says that "the risen Jesus had undergone a change from the Jesus of the ministry...that (his) body is changed so that it is no longer physical but spiritual."—

The fact that the Biblical accounts of Jesus' post-resurrection appearances provide few details about the resurrected Jesus has, over the centuries since, allowed artists to interpret the resurrection in different ways. Grünewald's interpretation of the resurrection on the Isenheim Altar fits well with what the Apostle John reported that Mary Magdalene had seen on that Easter morning. In the Altar painting, Jesus' whole body has become light. That reminds us of Jesus' "dazzling white" appearance during the transfiguration (Mark 9:3). Indeed, the artist seems to have created a visual union of the mysteries of the transfiguration, the resurrection, and the ascension.

Jesus' physical appearance in this painting is different. Except for the visible scars from the crucifixion nails and the piercing wound on his side, the marks of torture are gone. His arms are extended out as he rises upward in ascension while his burial shroud trails behind him. Mary Magdalene's eyewitness account and Grünewald's portrayal of the resurrection tell us that "*Christ is risen indeed*," and that the resurrected Jesus embodies the "*new creation*" that we read about in the Book of Revelation.

Mary Magdalene's dialogue with the resurrected Jesus leaves us with two additional lessons. When Jesus called "Mary," by her name, she did not, however, call Jesus by his name. She called him "Rabboni," my Teacher. Mary's recognition of Jesus as her Teacher was a call for her and for us to learn and live the teachings of Jesus in our lives as well.

Jesus' instruction to Mary Magdalene, "go to my brothers and tell them" was a command not just for Mary, but for Christians everywhere. Mary responded by going to others to tell them, "I have seen the Lord!" This becomes a call for Christians who have seen the living Lord's redeeming work in their lives to also tell others, "I have seen the Lord!"
