All things come from you, and of your own have we given you. 1Chronicles 29:14

Stewardship has many facets, and one is how we use our money, primarily in ways that help us grow in our relationship with God. It is God's, and God cares deeply that we steward our time, talents and treasures in ways that serve God's purposes for us, our neighbors in need, and for the well-being of the whole world.

One of my most favorite seminary professors, Mark Allan Powell, in his book, Giving to God, talks about how stewardship is first an act of worship. We hear in the Hebrew scriptures how the ancient Israelites brought their offerings or sacrifices to the altar—drink and grain offerings, animals, first fruits, the best of what they had. Remember what happened to those offerings? Yep. Lit on fire and consumed by flames. Yet, what happened to the offering after it was placed on the altar wasn't as important as the act of putting it there in the first place. The reasons for these sacrifices varied, but one thing was constant, the giving up of what was precious was done as an act of worship. The Israelites knew all they had belonged to God, given to them to care for. With heartfelt thanksgiving and devotion, they gave the best of the best back to God.

Worship was a spiritual need for a people who were immersed in a way of life centered on God; they gave to God what was valuable to them because they wanted and needed to give it. One scholar noted that we ought to give not our money if we have enough but instead give what we are short on so that our giving is meaningful and genuine. So, if you are crazy busy and your calendar is overflowing give God your time. In devotion, study or maybe a church event. God wants not what we have but what we value. God ought to be our priority above all else.

We too should give not just our treasures, but our time and our talents as well as an act of worship to God. As Powell writes, "The offering is a worship event that provides us with an opportunity for expressing our love for God in the purest way imaginable, by giving up something that we value."

I pray that the Spirit moves us to give of ourselves in faith and with delight, to worship the God from whom all blessings flow.

Future Planning Update:

The committee met with the bishop and synod representatives about our proposed changes on September 24th. Their suggestions were incorporated into our draft last week and our final proposal was sent back to synod for their final review on September 29th. The next step is for our Council to review the approved proposal and to formally recommend the changes to the congregation. At that point the full proposed constitution and bylaws will be sent to all voting members of the congregation. Q& A Sessions are being planned for members to discuss the changes and to get answers to any questions.

This has a been a long process but we are getting close to a final product. The leadership structure will be different than what we are used to but we hope the changes will be useful to our church. The committee thanks the congregation, for participating in the two rounds of Listening Sessions, and the Council for their continued support in this process.

Slovenia Update... From Disciple to Disciple-Maker

"I feel so much lighter now!" Aljaž shared after he and Žan prayed together. In that moment, Aljaž surrendered his life fully to Jesus for the first time and immediately felt the peace and presence of the Holy Spirit.

For several months, Aljaž and Žan, long-time high school friends, had been meeting weekly to read Scripture through Discovery Bible Study, while Jordan and I coached Žan along the way. When Aljaž gave his life to Christ, Žan was overjoyed. Almost immediately, Aljaž began to see God transforming his life. He felt conviction in areas where he needed to change and prayed with Žan for strength. As God worked in him, his excitement for the gospel grew, along with a deep desire to share it with others.

He began telling his friends about the difference Jesus was making in his life. Their curiosity opened the door for Aljaž to start not just one, but two Discovery Bible Study groups—one with his high school friends and another with some of his boxing club buddies. Once a week, they gather to read, discuss, and apply Scripture together. At the same time, he began reading the Bible with his girlfriend, who now also identifies as a believer!

"I can't wait until I have a disciple of my own," Aljaž told me. "Just like I am to Žan, I want someone for myself." We affirmed his vision and prayed together, echoing Paul's charge to Timothy: "And what you have heard from me through many witnesses entrust to faithful people who will be able to teach others as well" (2 Timothy 2:2). This is multiplication in action. And this is what it will take to see Bible Discovery Groups in all 212 municipalities of Slovenia—disciples making disciples, who in turn disciple others. Pray for Aljaž, that his faith would deepen, his groups would remain faithful to God's Word, and his influence would continue to multiply among his peers. Pray for Žan, that he would grow as a spiritual leader and disciple-maker, equipping others with patience, wisdom, and courage.

A BIBLE STUDY ABOUT THE LEADERSHIP OF

GOD;S PEOPLE

The Grace Council recently authorized a

Long-Range Planning Committee to evaluate and enhance Grace's resources for the future. One result will be changes in how Grace's system of government is structured. To help Grace serve as a viable small church, a new Constitution and Bylaws are being prepared that simplify this structure. The effectiveness of that new structure will now depend upon how



Grace's members respond to future calls to serve in leadership roles. That concern of course raises a question regarding what the Bible says about leadership. How does God want us to act when we are called to serve in leadership roles? This Bible study examines those questions. **Gary Anderson**

Deuteronomy 1:13, 15-1 (NIV)

¹³Choose some wise, understanding and respected men (and women) from each of your tribes, and I will set them over you." ...

¹⁵So I took the leading men (and women) of your tribes, wise and respected (people), and appointed them to have authority over you—as commanders of thousands, of hundreds, of fifties and of tens and as tribal officials. ¹⁶And I charged your judges at that time, "Hear the disputes between your people and judge fairly, whether the case is between two Israelites or between an Israelite and a foreigner residing among you. ¹⁷Do not show partiality in judging; hear both small and great alike. Do not be afraid of anyone, for judgment belongs to God. Bring me any case too hard for you, and I will hear it." (The words in brackets were added by the author.)

Biblical Leadership Applies to Women and Men. In this scripture, God is speaking to the people through Moses. Moses and the Israelites had advanced to the territory of Moab, east of the Jordan, and they were nearing the time when they would enter the promised land. The first thing we need to get straight here is that leadership is not restricted to "men." Bible writing was always controlled by men, and they sought to protect their misguided dominance. However, by the time they got to the New Testament that exclusivity had begun to erode as Bible writers came to understood God's real intent. In Galatians 3:28, we read, "There is neither Jew not Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female." In Romans 16:1-2, Paul, who struggled with his misogyny, wrote, "I commend to you our sister Phoebe, a deacon of the church." The call to leadership applies to all people, women and men.

Leadership is Exercised through Ordered Structures. The scripture speaks of appointing leaders as commanders over thousands-hundreds-fifties-tens. The structure envisioned in the new Grace Constitution

reflects a similar structure: ELCA Church--Northwest Ohio Synod—Grace Congregation--Grace Council—Grace's small group ministry teams.



Lucas Cranach's painting of Jesus and the Adulteress whom Jewish leaders wanted to stone to death became a lesson in judging fairly when he invited "someone without sin to cast the first stone."

Leaders Must be Responsive and Fair. God's instructions for the Israelite leaders were straight-forward and simple, "Hear the disputes between your people and judge fairly." When there is an issue requiring action, God's instructions were to be responsive, "hear the dispute!" The other part of that instruction was equally simple, "Judge fairly!" God's calls for fairness, justice and righteousness took center stage in the prophesies of Old Testament Prophets who were active after the Israelites established themselves as a nation. Who, for example can forget Amos's call to "let justice roll on like a river, righteousness like a never-failing stream."

Leaders Must be Impartial. God's instructions in this scripture are to "hear both great and small alike." It's too easy to spend

time on issues of the rich and powerful. God wants us to treat the issues of the poor and down-trodden with just as much energy as the cases of the rich and powerful.

God is Ready to Help Leaders. This scripture closes with God's assurance that if your leadership challenge is too great, "Do not be afraid of anyone." He goes on to offer help, "Bring me any case too hard for you, and I will hear it." This is where prayer comes in. A leader of God's people needs a healthy prayer relationship with God. When the leader's concerns are "too hard," it's time to take them to God.

The Old and New Testaments have many scripture readings that teach us about the qualities of leadership, and especially about the leadership of God's people. Here we will quote just one more of the many, but in your personal Bible studies, looking for lessons about leadership is something worth doing.

I Peter 5:1-4 (NIV)

¹To the elders among you, I appeal as a fellow elder and a witness of Christ's sufferings who also will share in the glory to be revealed: ²Be shepherds of God's flock that is under your care, watching over them—not because you must, but because you are willing, as God wants you to be; ³not pursuing dishonest gain, but eager to serve; not lording it over those entrusted to you, but being examples to the flock. ⁴And when the Chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the crown of glory that will never fade away.

The leadership of God's people is His call for many of us to "be shepherds...as God wants (us) to be." We are called to renounce "dishonest gain," and deal with others while acting as their servants ("not lording it over those entrusted to us"). Above all, we are called to be "examples to the flock."

The members of Grace ELC-Elmore have expressed a strong desire to thrive as a church. For Grace to do that, and even to grow, this means many of us will be called to serve in future leadership positions. May our answers be like Samuel's, "Speak, for your servant is listening."
