A BIBLE STUDY ABOUT ESTHER—A JEWISH NATIONAL HEROINE

Last week's Bible Study discussed a Jewish youth named Daniel who became a trusted and powerful official in the Babylonian and Persian regimes that had conquered Israel and Judah. This week's study considers another Jewish person who became a Persian Queen and national heroine by saving the Jewish people who were in exile in Persia from annihilation.

Esther 2:16-17 (NKJV)

¹⁶So <u>Esther</u> was taken to <u>King Ahasuerus</u>, into his royal palace, in the tenth month...in the seventh year of his reign. ¹⁷The king loved Esther more than all the other women, and she obtained grace and favor in his sight more than all the virgins; so, he set the royal crown upon her head and <u>made her queen</u> instead of Vashti.

Esther 3:8-9 (NKJV)

⁸Then <u>Haman</u> said to King Ahasuerus, "There is a certain people scattered and dispersed among the people in all the provinces of your kingdom; their laws are different from all other people's, and they do not keep the king's laws. Therefore, it is not fitting for the king to let them remain. ⁹If it pleases the king, let a <u>decree</u> be written that they be destroyed...

Esther 8:3-6 (NKJV)

³Now <u>Esther spoke again to the king</u>, fell down at his feet, <u>and implored him with tears to counteract the evil of Haman the Agagite</u>, and the scheme which he had <u>devised against the Jews</u>. ⁴And the king held out the golden scepter toward Esther. So, Esther arose and stood before the king, ⁵and said, "If it pleases the king, and if I have found favor in his sight and the thing seems right to the king and I am pleasing in his eyes, let it be written to revoke the letters devised by Haman...which he wrote to annihilate the Jews who are in all the king's provinces. ⁶For how can I endure to see the evil that will come to my people? Or how can I endure to see the destruction of my countrymen?"

The Book of Esther is one of only two books in the Bible that are named after women. It is the only book in the Bible that does not mention God. Like the Book of Daniel, which we discussed last week, Most Bible scholars doubt that there was an

historical Daniel or Esther. Nevertheless, their stories convey important messages that have had lasting meanings for God's people. The Book of Esther is read during the annual Jewish Festival of Purim which celebrates the deliverance of the Jewish people from threatened annihilation.

Like the Daniel story, the setting for the story of Esther occurred during the Jewish exile in Babylonia and Persia. The Persian King in the Book of Esther is

Ahasuerus, or King Xerxes, who ruled from 485 BCE to 464 BCE. The story began when King Ahasuerus deposed his first wife, Queen Vashti, after she defied the king's decree that "*all wives will honor their husbands*" (Esther 1:20). The king's servants were charged with finding the most beautiful women in the land, from whom "the woman that pleases the king will be queen" (Esther 2:4).

Esther was an orphan girl who grew up in the home of her cousin Mordecai, in the Persian capital city of Susa. She was very beautiful and was chosen to be one of the candidates for the new queen, but Mordecai had instructed her not to disclose that she was Jewish. After several months of training and preparation, Esther was taken to the King, who "loved her more than all the other women" (Esther 2:17) so she became Queen Esther.

After Esther became Queen, Mordecai learned that two of the King's staff were plotting to assassinate him. He told Esther who warned the King and saved his life. The King executed

the two plotters and appointed a man named Haman as his chief of staff. Haman let the authority of his position go to his head and began to demand that everyone bow down and "*pay him homage*." Mordecai refused to bow down before Haman, so Haman convinced the King to issue a decree that the entire Jewish population in Persia shall be annihilated. Haman advanced 10,000 silver talents to pay for their extermination and he cast lots (*Purim*) to determine the date when it would take place.

Mordecai learned of these plans and strategized with Esther regarding how she could approach the King to appeal to save the Jewish people. The story gets even more complicated from there. Haman made plans to hang Mordecai, but when the King was reminded about how Mordecai had saved his life, he ordered Haman to publicly honor Mordecai. Esther was mortally fearful of revealing her Jewishness to the King as part of her appeal to convince him to spare the Jewish people from Haman's planned extermination. She finally was able to arrange a banquet for the King during which she explained how Haman was preparing to kill all the Jewish people according to the King's decree, and that this would also include her (*Surprise—I'm Jewish too!*). The King became furious with Haman and had him hanged on the gallows Haman had planned to use to hang Mordecai.

The King gave Haman's estate to Esther, and he made Mordecai his adviser. The King then issued a new order giving the Jewish people the right to defend themselves against their oppressors on the same day when Haman's casting of lots (*Purim*) had designated for their extermination. That day became the day of the <u>Jewish Feast of Purim</u>, which <u>celebrates the deliverance of the Jewish people from a planned annihilation.</u> Esther acted as a leader of God's people by risking her life when she revealed her Jewish identity to the King, but she convinced the King to spare her people. Today the Jewish people celebrate the Feast of Purim as a national holiday in much the same way that the American people celebrate the fourth of July.
